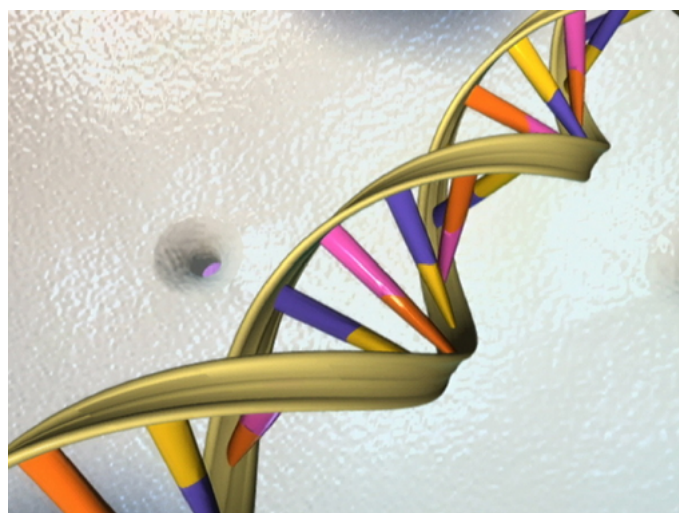

Diversity in data and the human genome.

The *All of Us* Research program just awarded 28.6 million dollars to three genome centers around the country to accelerate medical discoveries based on genomic data. These centers will be using anonymous samples from participants in the *All of Us* Research Program to provide researchers with

data that could lead to more tailored medical treatments and prevention strategies in the future.

Key to the success of this effort? A diverse group of people willing to participate in the program.

"Diversity is a hallmark of this effort. We strive for diversity of people and also diversity of data types, so researchers can understand the many factors that influence health and health outcomes for each of us," said Eric Dishman, director of the All of Us Research Program.
