However, Stonewall wasn't the first. Three years earlier in San Francisco's Tenderloin district, the Compton's Cafeteria riot occurred, which is considered the first recorded LGBTQ protest of its type. 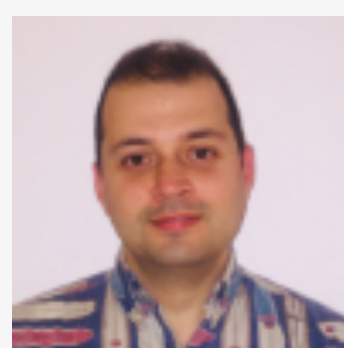
The PRIDE Study Updates: JAMIA article + new staff
