NEW LGBTQ+ video testimonials for *All of Us*

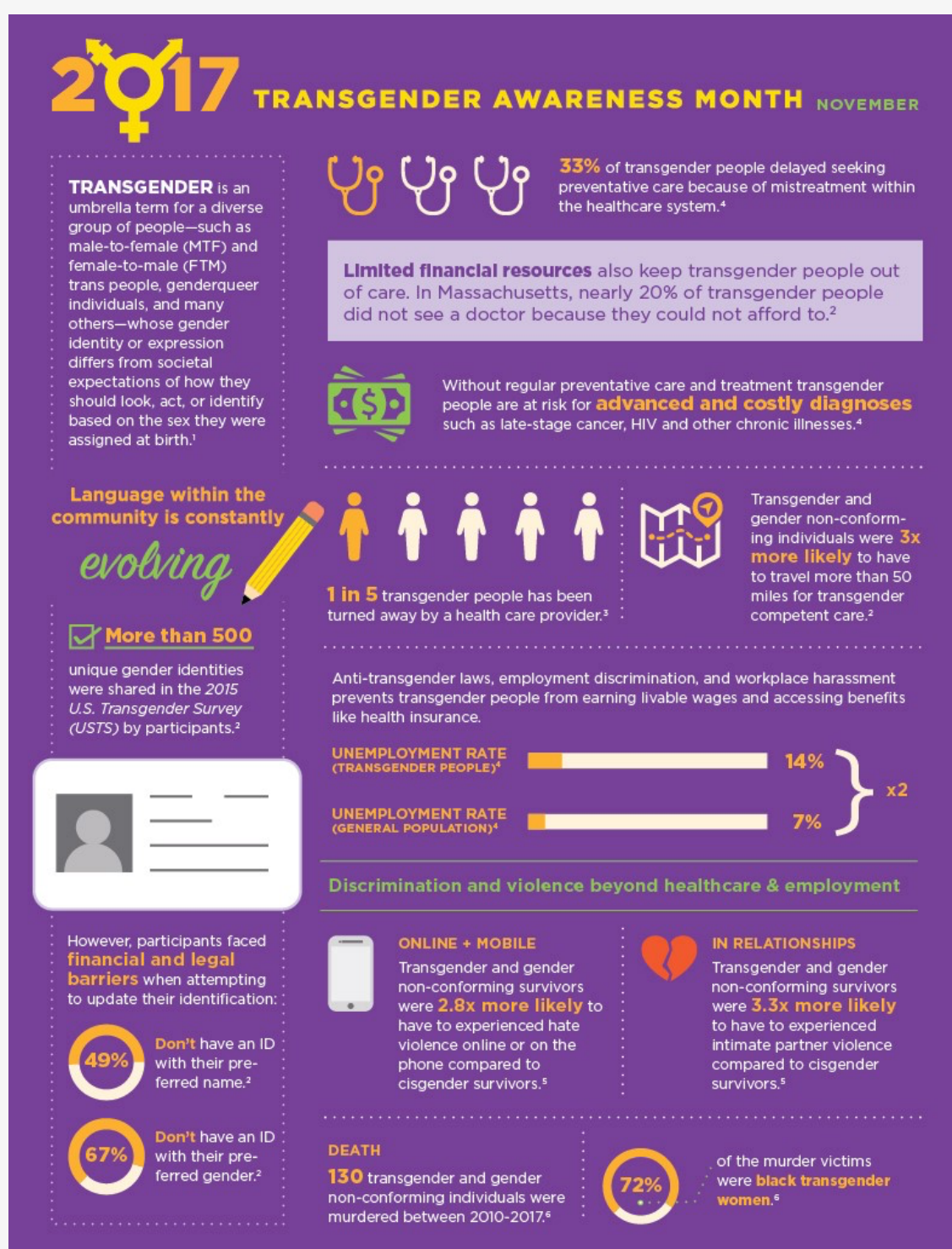
