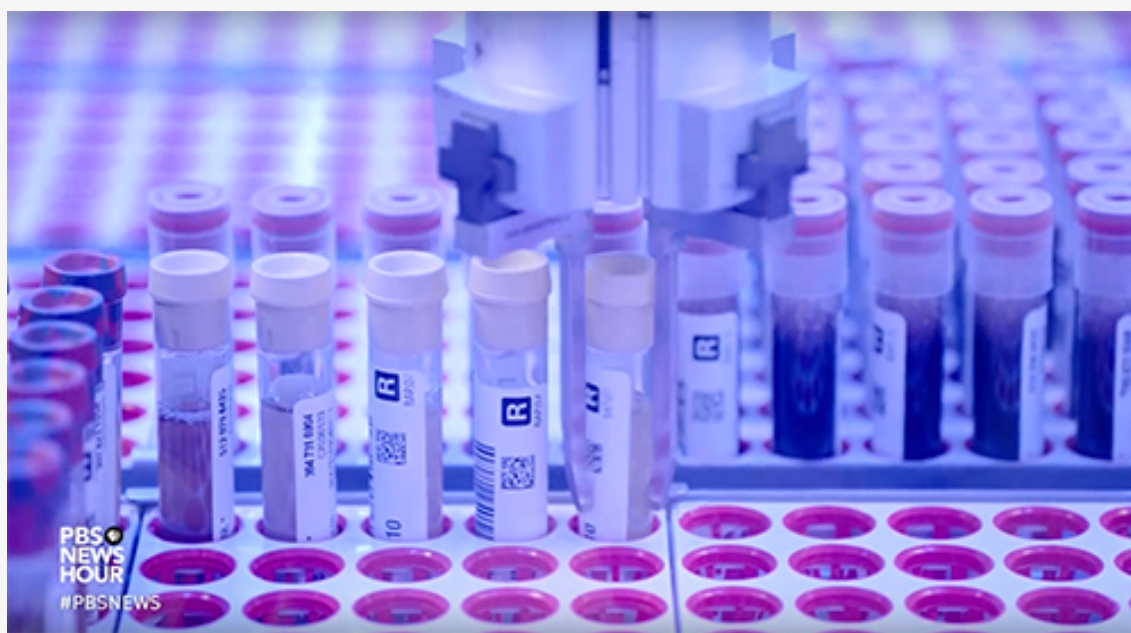


## The PRIDE Study Research Published
