



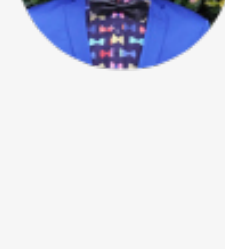
Dear Friend,

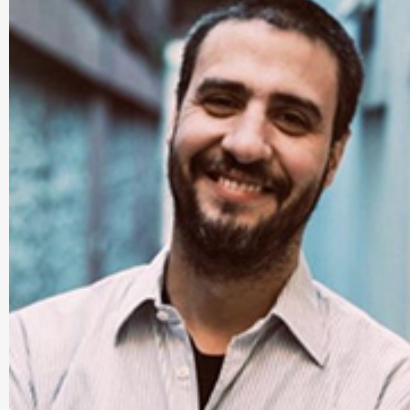

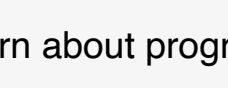

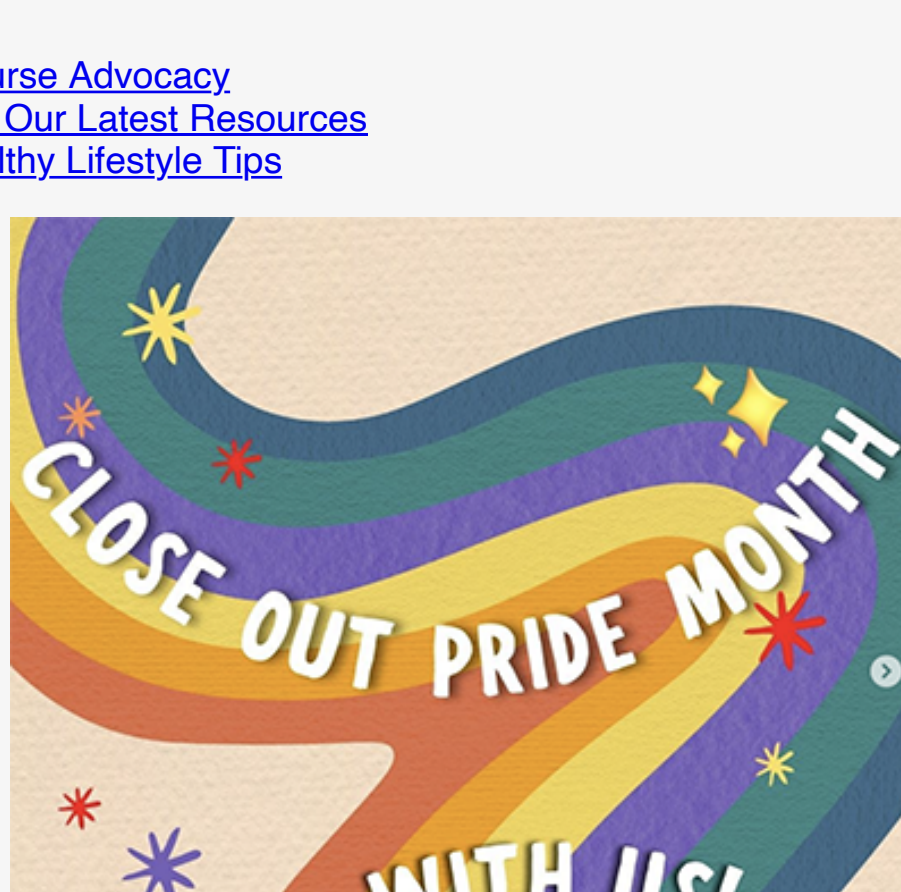
